
Address from Director, NICPR

I am delighted to announce the issuance of half-yearly newsletter of National Institute of Cancer Prevention and Research (NICPR, ICMR) for the year 2021.

The year began on a positive note indicating declining trends in positivity rates of SARS CoV-2 infection across the state. However, by April the second wave of COVID-19 struck us all. Lockdown was imposed, several of our staff members both permanent and contractual or their family members were infected. Despite this, Team NICPR continued to support COVID-19 containment efforts. The High Throughput Viral Diagnostic Laboratory continued to work 24x7 in three shifts for carrying out RT-PCR testing, and till date more than 13 lakh tests have been done to support testing in Western Uttar Pradesh and Delhi.

Besides this, Tobacco cessation and control activities were carried on including through telephonic counseling, Nukkad natak, painting competitions etc were organized. 

April 15th 2021:

Webinar on Implementation of Article 5.3 and the Code of Conduct issued u/Article 5.3 of WHO FCTC organized by The WHO FCTC Global Knowledge Hub on Smokeless Tobacco (GKH-

SLT). The webinar was attended by more than 70 participants from all the ICMR institutions. During the Webinar, the tobacco control experts gave a deep insight into the provisions of WHO FCTC to counter Tobacco Industry Interference and the Code of Conduct of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare to be followed by government officials when interacting with Tobacco industry. Eminent panelists included Dr Shalini Singh, Director, ICMR-NICPR, and WHO FCTC GKH-SLT, Dr R S Dhaliwal, Scientist 'G' & Head, Division of Non-Communicable Diseases, ICMR, Dr Amit Yadav, Senior Technical Advisor-Tobacco Control, The Union, Dr Jagdish Kaur, Regional Advisor, Tobacco Free Initiative, WHO Regional Office for South-East Asia, Dr L Swasticharan, Additional DDG (LS) MOHFW, Govt. of India and Dr Upendra Bhojani, Assistant Director, IIPH, Bengaluru. The State Consultants from UP and Karnataka apprised the participants about their first-hand experiences implementing Article 5.3 in their state under the National Tobacco Control Programme.



May 2021:

To commemorate World No Tobacco Day, a Facebook live session was conducted through zoom platform on 30th May, 2021, wherein the Director of WHO FCTC GKH-SLT, Dr. Shalini Singh while addressing this global tobacco epidemic highlighted the steps taken by the country and NICPR in mitigating this tobacco epidemic. On **31st May, 2021**, a webinar was organised by WHO FCTC GKH-SLT through Zoom platform on a very pertinent topic- "**Commit to Quit Tobacco: To avoid the Deadly Quartet- Covid-19, Cardiovascular diseases (CVDs), Respiratory diseases and Cancer**".



The panelists for the webinar were **Dr. Shalini Singh**, *Director ICMR-NICPR*, **Dr. (Prof) Shekhar Kashyap**, *Interventional Cardiologist*, **Dr. Yatan Pal Singh Balhara**, *Addl. Professor Psychiatry*, *AIIMS*, *New Delhi* and **Dr. R.K. Mani**, *Director Critical Care and Pulmonology*, *Yashoda Superspeciality Hospital*, *Kaushambi* who deliberated on the effects of tobacco on the deadly quartet. The panelists shared their vast clinical experience in managing critical patients and assisting users quit tobacco. The future roadmap of activities to control this growing menace of tobacco was also drawn.

Participants were introduced to theory of molecular docking and dynamics along with hands on practical experience was given on organic molecule sketching, protein and ligand preparation, molecular docking and dynamics for lead identification





2. WHO FCTC Global Knowledge Hub on Smokeless Tobacco (KH-SLT)

The focal point to collect, generate and disseminate the correct scientific knowledge and information on smokeless tobacco. KH-SLT has successfully engaged with parties and has undertaken several activities in the past six months. KH-SLT initiated a dialogue with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare about smokeless tobacco products and spitting in public places and their ill effects in aggravating the COVID-19 pandemic post which Ministry of Health and Family Welfare issued an appeal to the public at large to refrain from consuming tobacco products and spitting in public highlighting its adverse effects on the health of people especially during the pandemic.



In March 2021, following the footsteps of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare's appeal, KH-SLT issued the "Statement to Partner Countries calling for strengthening tobacco control measures and prohibiting spitting in Public Places" and supported by the WHO FCTC Secretariat. In addition to research-based activities, KH-SLT has also engaged successfully in evidence-based advocacy through conferences, expert meetings, and webinars, thus engaging in the permeation of information and knowledge sharing. KH-SLT has produced several publications on tobacco epidemiology in peer-reviewed journals with high impact factors and advocacy documents, published in the public domain.

- 1. Feasibility of Integrating Tobacco Use Screening and Tobacco Cessation Services with routine ANC Services - A pilot study in the district hospital of Gautam Buddha Nagar Funding agency: ICMR, New Delhi. Duration of project: 3 years (2021-2024).
- 2. To explore the SALL transcription factor family in breast carcinogenesis. (ICMR-SRF) Funding agency: ICMR, New Delhi. Duration of project: 3 years (2020-2023).
- 3. Genome wide methylation profiling of north Indian gallbladder patients. (ICMR-RA) Funding agency: ICMR, New Delhi. Duration of project: 3 years (2020-2023).
- 4. Brain derived neurotrophic factor (BDNF) and its receptor, TrkB in gall bladder carcinoma: potential biomarkers and prognostic markers Funding Agency: ICMR. Duration: 3 years (2021-2024).
- 5. To decipher and target the metabolic signatures associated with Epirubicine- resistant triple negative breast cancer".

Funding agency: ICMR Duration of project: 3 years.

6. Identification of prognostic marker for mTOR kinase inhibitor and their mechanisms of therapeutic resistance in breast cancer.

Funding agency: DHR Duration of project: 3 years.

7. Identifying anti-cancerous phytomolecule combinations against cancers for leveraging traditional drug discovery.

Funding agency: ICMR Duration: 2 Years
